Purpose: The goal of the National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS) Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award (NRSA) Predoctoral Basic Biomedical Sciences Research Training Program is to develop a pool of well-trained scientists available to address the nation's biomedical research agenda. Specifically, this funding announcement provides support to eligible, domestic organizations to develop and implement effective, evidence-informed approaches to biomedical graduate training and mentoring that will keep pace with the rapid evolution of the biomedical research enterprise. NIGMS expects that the proposed research training programs will incorporate didactic, research, and career development elements to prepare trainees for careers that will have a significant impact on the health-related research needs of the nation.

This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) does not allow appointed Trainees to lead an independent clinical trial, but does allow them to obtain research experience in a clinical trial led by a mentor or co-mentor.

Goal(s): NIH's mission is to seek fundamental knowledge about the nature and behavior of living systems and the application of that knowledge to enhance health, lengthen life, and reduce illness and disability.

- If the proposal or a similar one has been submitted to the named federal sponsor previously, written review feedback and a summary of communications with the program office/directorate/representative of the agency is required.
- Project Summary of the PHS 398 Research Training Program Plan (Overall Impact) of three (3) pages (maximum) describing how the proposed training program will produce a pool of trainees with the technical, operational, and professional skills necessary to conduct rigorous and reproducible research, and transition into careers in the biomedical research workforce. Additionally, describe how the program will enable research-oriented individuals from a range of educational backgrounds the ability to participate and succeed in the research training program (for example, through recruitment and mentor training activities).

Internal applications will be reviewed relative to the Scored Review Criteria as outlined in the NOFO as well as the Additional Review Criteria specific to this NOFO.
